Breed-a-Roan

This year the Society ran the 'Breed-a-Roan' scheme which was a huge success. The Society offered a number of free AI straws to both beef and dairy farmers. This campaign was primarily aimed at non-pedigree breeders in an effort to encourage as many farmers as possible to try out the Shorthorn breed as an option. Our aim is that in future, this will help increase our market share and benefit pedigree breeders as a result. Successful applicants could choose from the following bulls:

- Doon Jupiter SH4929
- Doon Jeremiah SH4932
- Glann Jenson SH9367
- Craigfaddock Parnasuss SH8703

The demand for these straws was incredibly high and all straws were booked within 72 hours of being offered.

This scheme was picked up by a number of media outlets. It featured on The Farmer's Journal, Agriland, and That's Farming. Our Secretary Joanne, and Vice President Amelda, spoke on radio to MJ from "Country Life with MJ Cleary". They spoke about the scheme and highlighted the many benefits of including shorthorn

genetics in both beef and dairy herds.

We would encourage all participants to make themselves aware of the criteria for this scheme. Straws must be used in the 2023 breeding season and feedback is required when calves are on the ground.

We look forward to the feedback from participants next year when we have Shorthorn calves on the ground as a result of this initiative.

TH & Myostatin Testing

All animals entering the society Premier Sale on 18th November 2023 MUST be TH TESTED and have their myostatin status. This is a requirement for <u>both male and female</u> animals throughout all age categories.



New Rule for 2024, the Irish Shorthorn Society will require <u>ALL</u> Male & Female calves to be genotyped before registration.

Dairy Herdbook

Work is currently ongoing behind the scenes in collaboration with ICBF to set up a separate Dairy Herdbook with the MS (Milking Shorthorn) breed identifier to be put in use across the board. This should reduce any present registration difficulties for dairy breeders. Currently a new Dairy Breeding Programme is being drafted with the DAFM to align breeding goals and aspirations for MS going forward. YDP

Moyside and Croghan clubs collaborated on a very successful YDP event at the end of June. Guest speakers included Niall Kilraine from ICBF and local Vet John Gilmore. Young people were shown how to make a halter, how to wash, dry and clip an animal for showing. All youths in attendance then had an opportunity to lead an animal around the showring, learning what to watch for when the animals are being judged and how to encourage animals to stand and pose correctly for judging. Bluecard Error

It has come to our attention that some animals in both Beef (SH) and Dairy (MS) are being identified wrong on their blue cards. This is an issue for your local DVO, however Joanne would like to work with you on these amendments and so the more that are drawn to her attention then the more she can help. Please check the breed mentioned on your bluecard when you receive after registration and get in touch with your local DVO for error correction.
